2024 means a new year, new beginnings, and new members. We all hope that this new year, brings us health and successful Legion endeavors.

Starting January 1^{st,} the lounge staff will be "carding" <u>everyone</u>, as you will be required to have your 2024 membership card to be served. If you have not renewed, do it today. Department will be sending out renewal notices in January. I **do not send** out these renewal letters, I have been receiving "not so nice" letters telling me to check my records. I will explain one more time, the Legion dues year goes from, June to June. If you pay your dues before January 1st you are entitled to Lounge privileges, that is a Post 4 rule, not a Department rule. Your 2023 card will allow you to continue to attend meetings, come to the Post (not be served any alcoholic drinks) until May 2024.

If you get a notice, but already have your 2024 membership card, please ignore the notice. If in doubt, check your records, or just simply call me. These steps will keep you from paying twice and save you and me some aggravation. I am retired so I have the time to process your renewal as soon as I receive payment. I am not the reason you may still get renewal notices. There are benefits to paying your dues every June, one of them is the Early Bird Dinner. If you have your new card by November 5th this year you are entitled to a free dinner. That is the Sunday before Veteran's Day and of course no interruption in Lounge privileges.

Dominick, at 8 years old, is the youngest member of the American Legion Harry Olrich Post 4, Mt. Clemens Michigan as a member of the Sons of The American Legion as well as being a Cub Scout.

Dominick is highly active for his age and when his schedule permits, he volunteers a helping hand at the Post whenever he is needed.

He does this excitedly, happily and with ultimate respect and reverence to the U.S. flag, Veterans, and all Post members.

Dominick will have large shoes to fill going forward. He will be the next generation of legionnaire. Dominick will be taking over for the senior members of the Post. Members like Mr. Ernie Owenby.

Ernie Owenby is the oldest member of American Legion Harry Olrich Post 4. He is 96 years of age and has been involved some of the largest turning points of World War 2.

Ernie enlisted in the U.S. Navy at the age of 17 in 1944. He earned the ratings of Machinist, Fireman, and Seaman First Class. During his enlistment he was assigned to a minesweeper with duties to sweep the vicinity of Okinawa prior to the invasion and then the waters surrounding the islands of Japan in preparation for a land invasion which never materialized due to the dropping of "Little Boy" and "Fat Man" on the cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, respectively.

After the dropping of the atomic bombs, Ernie's minesweeper was assigned the duty of sweeping the Omura and Hiroshima Bays to clear any mines so that U.S. Navy hospital ships could enter and help the survivors of the atomic blasts.

After Ernie left the service, he went to work for the Uniroyal Company for 30 years until his plant closed. Ernie is a widower with 9 adult children and their extended families. He has been a member of the American Legion for 14 years.

During the interview with Mr. Owenby, he seemed very happy to be "passing the torch" to the youngest generation of legionnaires.
